**EAST PECKHAM PARISH COUNCIL - SERVING THE PEOPLE OF EAST PECKHAM:** East Peckham Parish is a 'civil' or 'administrative' designation. The Parish Council is the third tier of local government, below Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council and Kent County Council. The Parish of East Peckham has around 1,200 households and 3,500 inhabitants, of whom 2,657 are on the Electoral Roll. East Peckham is bordered by the parishes of Hadlow, Nettlestead, Yalding, Mereworth and Paddock Wood.

East Peckham Parish Council is made up of 11 members, elected every four years. The full council meets in public 11 times a year. There are additional monthly meetings of the Planning Committee and our Finance Committee meets twice annually. The Councillors are unpaid, local people, elected by local people. These volunteers put themselves forward for election to represent the community and give their time freely and willingly for the benefit of the whole village.

**CASUAL VACANCY:** A casual vacancy currently exists for the office of Councillor which we are able to fill by co-option. We are looking to complete the co-option process as soon as possible. **COMPLETION OF THE 2012/2013 ANNUAL AUDIT:** The external auditor has completed the audit and has certified our Annual Return for the financial year ending on 31 March 2013. The auditor's certificate and opinion states 'On the basis of our review, in our opinion the information in the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and no matters have come to our attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.'

**EAST PECKHAM PRIMARY SCHOOL CITIZENSHIP AWARD:** We are delighted to sponsor this annual award and would like to congratulate Kieran Gregory who was the 2013 recipient. In July, our Chairman Graham Haycock presented Kieran with a book voucher at the Year 6 Leavers Assembly.

**PARISH COUNCIL CORPORATE LOGO:** We are currently considering a new corporate logo; possibilities could include the traditional hop or our very own village sign. We would like to hear from you if you have any other ideas.

**BRANBRIDGES ROAD LATEST UPDATE (*Rose & Crown Public House*):** Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council inspected the site on 11 September 2013. Whilst the brick rubble arising from the demolition of the brick wall has been removed there was still a small pile of refuse to be removed. The fence required to be erected by the Section 215 Notice had also not been erected. As the property is being advertised for sale, TMBC are making enquiries to confirm the current ownership. The case is then due to be discussed with TMBC's legal advisors to consider legal proceedings in the Magistrates Court or other appropriate action.

**PARISH PLAN:** During 2013/2014 the Parish Plan Steering Group will push ahead and complete the Parish Plan. All of the parish councillors will be involved but community involvement would also be welcomed. If you would like to be involved please let us know.

**PARISH CARETAKER SCHEME:** We have been delayed in our desire to take on additional services from Kent Highway Services and Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council. Whilst we have the preliminary support of Kent County Council we have not yet been able to enter discussions with Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council who are yet to establish if there are any exit clauses on their existing contractual obligations.

**HIGHWAYS:** Potholes and other highway problems can be reported directly to Kent Highways. If you need to report an emergency situation call them straight away on 08458 247 800 or by reporting the fault to on the website <http://www.kent.gov.uk/highwayfaults>

**DOG FOULING:** Failing to clear up after your dog is an offence. It is disgusting, it is a nuisance and can be a health hazard, do not tolerate it – report it. Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council enforces dog fouling through the Dogs Fouling of Land Act 1996 which applies to all land within the borough which is in the open air and to which members of the public have access. The Borough Council will respond to all complaints regarding dog fouling in public places. Their Dog Warden will respond to information obtained, visit areas to try and catch offenders and will take action against anyone caught failing to clear up. If you have a dog fouling complaint try and obtain as much information as possible. Do not approach the offender or try to deal with it yourself; it may not be safe to do so. Try and find out where the dog lives, the breed and colour of the dog that is fouling, a description of anyone seen with the dog when it fouls, the time of day when it's happening. All this information will assist the Dog Warden. The message is clear - Clean up after your dog, bag it and dispose of it responsibly. Subject to availability we do have dog bags in the Parish Office which we provide free of charge.

**LITTERING:** As you know litter does not clear itself away. It can take years to degrade causing harm to the environment. Research shows that litter contributes towards further crime and that people feel less safe in areas that are littered. The cost of clearing up litter runs into hundreds and thousands of pounds - Council Tax payer's money; your money. It is an offence to leave litter and a person is guilty of an offence if they throw down, drop or otherwise deposit and then leave it in a public place. The Clean Neighbourhoods Act 2005 has removed any doubt by explicitly stating that litter includes smoking and chewing gum related material. Officers from Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council will respond to complaints and have the power to demand a persons name and address in order to issue them with a fixed penalty notice.

**PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY:** If you have encountered a problem on one or more Public Rights of Ways please report it on 0845 345 0210 (Lines open 8am - 8pm Monday - Friday), for emergencies on 0300 333 5538 or use the online fault reporting tool on Kent County Councils website.

**ENVIRONMENTAL ENHANCEMENTS:** We are continuing with our programme of village environmental enhancements the next phase being the installation of finger post signs. We have commissioned two new finger post signs which will be installed at Bullen Lane and Peckham Bush during the autumn. We are delighted that Kent Highways Services has offered us funding of £3,573.90 towards the costs of the finger signposts.

**BULKY REFUSE:** The fortnightly Saturday bulky service now has separate collections of Waste Electrical & Electronic Equipment (WEEE) and scrap metal items. Items collected will be stripped down into their component materials and recycled.

**WAR MEMORIAL RENOVATIONS:** We are intending to complete the renovations of the war memorial, funding is in place and all that is needed is a start date for the commencement of the work, we are liaising with our preferred contractor in this respect.

**CRIME PREVENTION:** Public communication remains an important part of crime prevention and a contact directory is available to join in order to receive electronic updates – the link is <http://www.kent.police.uk/enews>. New crime prevention guides are available at [http://www.kent.police.uk/advice/personal/your\\_guide.html](http://www.kent.police.uk/advice/personal/your_guide.html). It doesn't matter what the crime is, please report it on 101 or contact the Community Warden Paul Harfleet on 07969 584183. East Peckham will not be in the schedule to be visited by the newly introduced police contact point as we already have a surgery which is attended by the Police Community Support Officers and our Community Warden and as a village we do not need the resource as much as some of the other smaller villages which do not have the facilities to run a regular surgery.

**SORRY NO TRICK OR TREAT:** We know that many residents are worried about people coming to their door at Halloween. You do not have to answer the door to them and you can make that clear by putting a notice in your window or door. If people call and their behaviour worries you, let a neighbour or the Community Warden know. Call 101 to report a crime and 999 in an emergency.

**JUBILEE HALL AND PLAYING FIELDS:** These are your facilities and we want you to enjoy using them. Activities which take place each week include keep fit, Zumba, French classes, gym, Children's Centre, badminton, bowls, Mini Music, Parent & Toddler group and a monthly Carers Group. If you would like details of any of these activities please let us know and we will pass your details onto the individual activity organisers. Our football pitches are used by The East Peckham Junior Football team and we have super fitness equipment and play equipment for children of all ages. If you are looking for a venue for an activity such as a sports event, book club, birthday party or a meeting then please contact us for details of availability and hire charges we can also arrange for you to have a tour of the facilities.

Sadly there has been some vandalism and anti-social behaviour on the playing fields and the car park. Whilst these incidents have been reported to the police and the issues dealt with it is frustrating for us to have to spend a great deal of time and Council Tax payer's money dealing with such matters. This affects the entire community not just nearby residents as all households contribute towards the maintenance costs through the Council Tax. If you know anything of these incidents or witness any other acts of vandalism or anti-social behaviour please report it to us, the police on 101 or to our Community Warden on 07969 584183. The CCTV system at the Jubilee Hall has been upgraded and should hopefully act as a deterrent and assist the police in catching those responsible for any acts of criminal and anti-social behaviour.

We have installed two vending machines which you are welcome to use when the Parish Office is open. The machine in the lobby dispenses cold drinks and snacks and the machine in the meeting room dispenses hot drinks. The prices of the vended items are very reasonable and have been set to cover the hire costs of the machines and the vended products. Free Wi-Fi access is also now available at the Jubilee Hall.

**ARBORCULTURIST INSPECTION:** We have a legal responsibility duty of care to inspect the trees on our land to ensure that they do not pose an unacceptable risk. In order to meet our legal obligations, a tree audit was recently carried out. All urgent work identified in the audit has been carried out and all non-urgent work will be carried out after 01 April 2014. Even a healthy tree can fail as it is impossible to ensure that no branches or whole trees will cause damage or injury at any time and the audit did attempt to prescribe a procedure to ensure that risk is reduced to an acceptable level. The audit does not attempt to prevent all failures, but does fulfil our legal responsibilities.

**COMMUNITY DEFIBRILATOR:** East Peckham is one of the first villages in the borough of Tonbridge and Malling to install a defibrillator in order to provide fast-response action for anyone suffering a cardiac arrest in the parish. Sudden cardiac death can affect anyone at any time, including about 12 people per week in the UK under the age of 35. When someone suffers a cardiac arrest, swift action is critical to ensure survival. However, due to the time it can take an ambulance to reach rural villages survival from cardiac arrest is reduced when compared to major towns – each minute of delay reduces the chance of survival by about 10%. As a result, the South East Coast Ambulance Service (SECAMB) has made it a priority to install defibrillators in rural communities and train villagers to use them.

Modern defibrillators are highly automated, light and portable and, after brief training, very easy to use. During October 2013, the defibrillator will be installed on the outside of the Jubilee Hall and will be available 24hrs a day. Until then it will be kept in the Parish Office. The Parish Council is delighted to be involved in this important community initiative, because the Jubilee Hall is in the heart of the community the defibrillator will be easily and quickly accessible to anyone who needs it. A defibrillator training programme has already started for anyone who wishes to learn how to use the device. The aim is to train as many people as possible to ensure that someone who knows how to use it is always on hand. Training is available free of charge, if you wish to learn more please let us know.

**POST OFFICE:** We have been advised that the East Peckham Post Office located at Pound Road will be closed between 19 October 2013 and 28 October 2013 inclusive. We have also been advised that from 11 November 2013 the Post Office services will transfer to the new outlet at Orchard Road, this date is however subject to change.

**TWINNING:** East Peckham is twinned with Chereng in the Nord de Pas de Calais. The East Peckham Twinning Association (EPTA) is independent of the Parish Council and twinning activities are funded by those taking part and by fund-raising with no use of parish funds. Future events include:

**FUTURE OF CHILDRENS CENTRE'S IN KENT:** KCC are consulting on their proposals on the future of Children's Centre's in Kent. Children's Centre's deliver high quality services, which means every child gets the healthiest start in life and is ready for school. They meet the needs of vulnerable children and their families at the earliest opportunity, working together with other professionals to deliver easy access to the services when and where needed and they work with pre-school children and their primary aged siblings to make sure families get the best all round help.

#### **Why is KCC consulting?**

- Public funding for Children's Centre's is reducing and they need to ensure money can be focused on actual services for children and their families and less on buildings and overheads.
- There is a need to change the way they work so that they can still meet the needs of the children and their families, particularly those who need the most support.
- KCC has reviewed the Children's Centre Programme and has developed a proposal which aims to:
  - deliver savings of at least £1.5 million
  - protect services which improved health, education and social care
  - continues to offer parents and expectant parents a choice about which Centre they use
  - ensure that support is given to those children and families who needed it most
  - Improve co-ordination and access to a range of services for families with children aged 0-11 where at least one child in the family is under 5 years old.

**What is KCC consulting on?** Reducing the number of Children's Centre's, linking Children's Centre's to reduce management and administrative costs and reducing the hours at some Children's Centre's.

### **How will East Peckham be affected?**

- The East Peckham and Hadlow Children's Centre is one of the centres facing closure
- Approximately 14–20 families attend the East Peckham drop in session which is held in the Jubilee Hall on a weekly basis and they will be adversely affected

**Have your say:** Full details on the proposals are set out in the Shaping the Future of Children's Centre's in Kent consultation document which is available on KCC's website. Paper copies are also available at Children's Centre's. The deadline for all responses is 04 October 2013.

**FREE REPLACEMENT BOILERS and LOFT AND CAVITY WALL INSULATION:** Action with Communities in Rural Kent has teamed up with British Gas to offer these **FREE** energy saving measures which you are entitled to if you are in receipt of eligible benefits including Child and Working Tax Credits, Pension Credit, ESA, Income Support. This is a Government initiative to cut energy bills and lower carbon emissions. You do NOT have to be a British Gas customer to qualify and there's no catch. If you are in receipt of benefits and live in private rented housing or own your own home and your boiler is inefficient due to age or is broken, you may be entitled to a replacement. **WOULD YOU LIKE YOUR POST OFFICE TO SUPPORT A COMMUNITY SCHEME?** Post Office branches in England (excluding Crown branches) can apply to receive up to £10,000 to support a new scheme or service for their local community. These could include:

- Classes in key skills such as reading, languages or the Internet
- Mentoring and advice service for local small businesses, or display space for local producers
- Partnership with a local charity to provide a meeting space, notice board and other forms of support
- A hub or meeting space for community groups involved in local issues

If you have an idea you'd like your Post Office to support, go to the [Post Office website](#) for more information. The deadline for applications is Friday 18 October 2013. The Fund is limited to supporting a maximum of 20 schemes in England in 2013/14 and winning bids will be selected by a panel comprising Post Office Ltd, Department for Communities and Local Government, and others. Judging will take place in autumn with the successful schemes announced shortly after.

**AGE UK PUBLISHES STUDY OF ISOLATION OF OLDER PEOPLE LIVING IN RURAL AREAS:** The report, Later Life in Rural England, looks at the challenges of living in rural areas for older people, such as higher living costs and relatively poor transport. It showcases different ways of overcoming them, drawing especially on creative practice from local Age UKs working with resourceful and innovative rural communities. The report can be downloaded from Age UK's website.

**SITA TRUST ENRICHING NATURE PROGRAMME:** Not-for-profit organisations may apply for large grants (£25,001 - £75,000) or small grants of up to £25,000 for biodiversity projects located within 10 miles of any landfill site in England or Wales. The landfill site can be operated by any company. The programme supports the recovery of species and habitats identified as a priority by both national and regional biodiversity action plans. Projects must focus on carrying out physical improvements to benefit species or habitats at identified sites. Expressions of Interest are due by 6 December 2013. The form can be downloaded from the [SITA Trust website](#) and should be submitted by email to the Trust.

**OIL CLUB:** The Oil-Club has launched in Tonbridge and the surrounding area. If you would like to find out more please visit the website [www.oil-club.co.uk](http://www.oil-club.co.uk). Club benefits include reduced heating oil costs, reduced HGV traffic through our village and reduced carbon exhausted into our environment. The Oil Club is an independent organisation and has no links to any of the suppliers. By grouping deliveries, the bulk purchase ability means that they are able to negotiate with their suppliers the best bulk purchase price for heating oil and pass on the savings to their members. A village with 100 members will save between 150 to 180 heavy duty vehicle trips a year through the village. A big saving on wear and tear to our village, our lanes, roads and to the environment.
